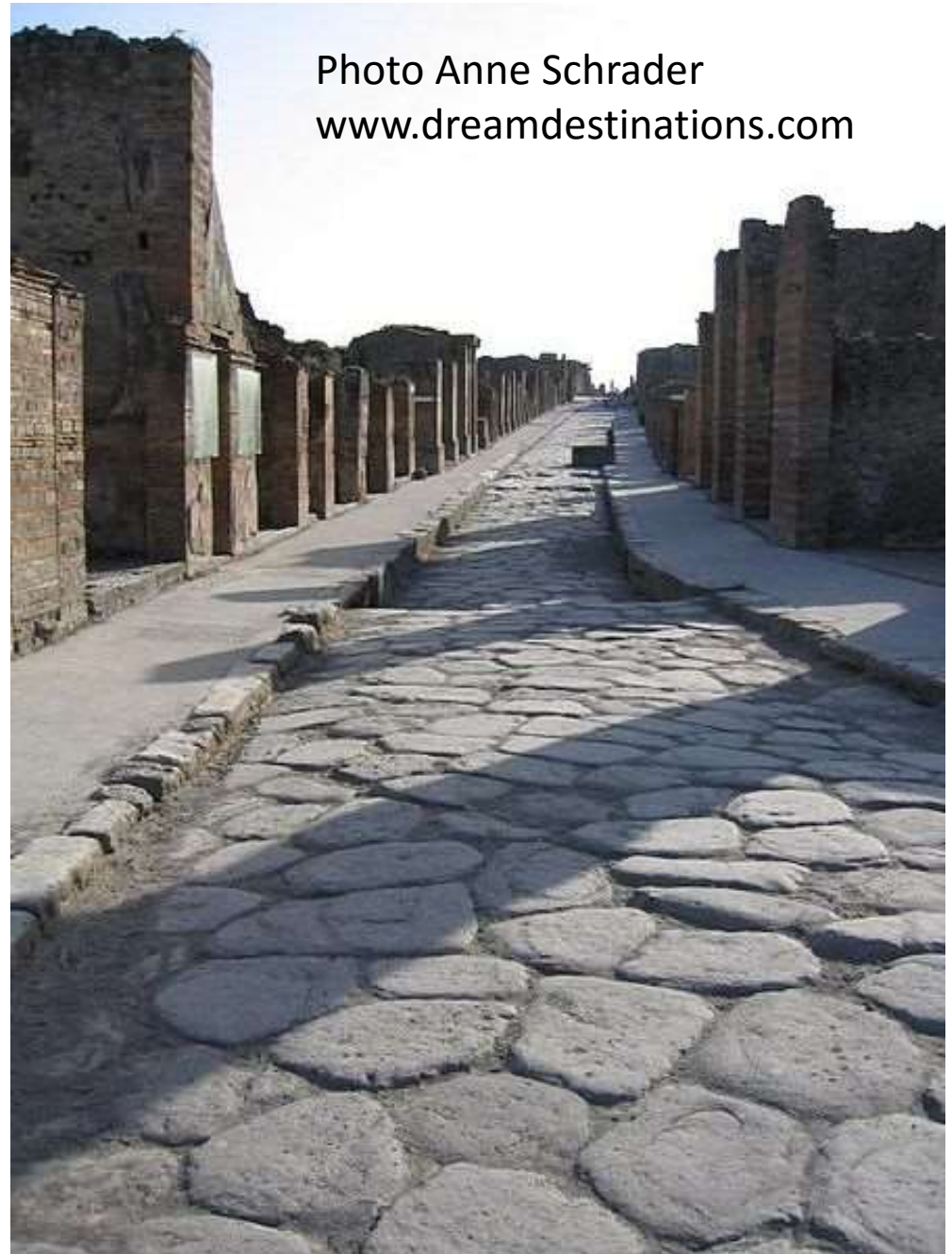


Pompeii
