- The eastern Mediterranean island of Cyprus has a rich, turbulent history stretching back to antiquity. Many countries have fought to control the island. The most recent fight was in 1974 and has resulted in a divided island with both Greece and Turkey claiming the island.

- Coastal Paphos is famed for its archaeological sites relating to the cult of Aphrodite, including ruins of palaces, tombs and mosaic-adorned villas.



Top Attractions


- The many archaeological and antiquities sites


